Must do's in Almaty

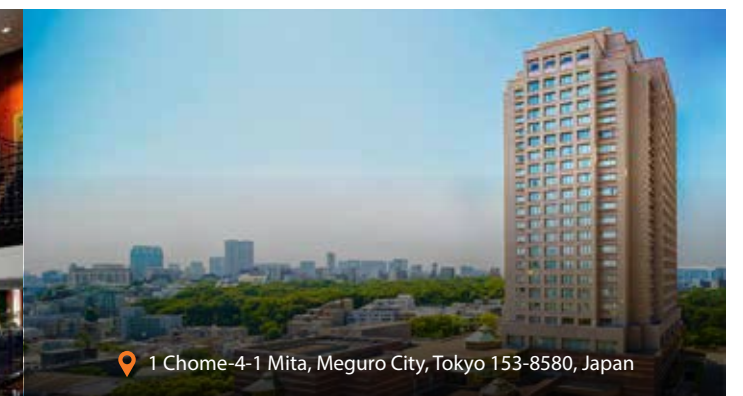
- 1. Medeu Skating Rink:** Known as the highest Olympic-sized ice skating rink in the world,

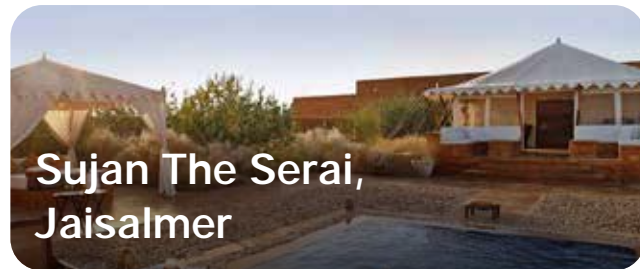

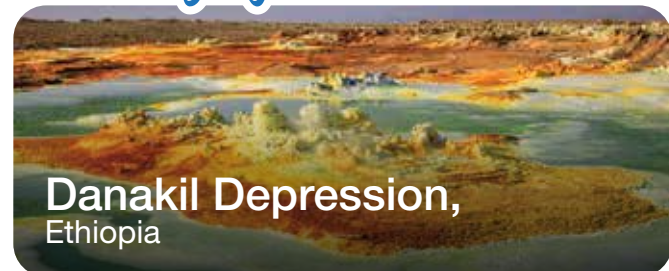


Sujan The Serai, Jaisalmer

Japan Immigration Eyes Pre-Screening Visa-Free Travelers; New System Would Resemble U.S. ESTA Program

The government has decided to pre-screen certain foreign travellers before they set out for Japan by having them declare their activities and places of stay in advance, it has been learned. The move aims to prevent foreigners from entering Japan for purposes such as terrorism or illegal work by preventing those seen as likely to cause problems from boarding Japan-bound planes, according to sources.

PhonePe users can now make payments via UPI in Singapore

PhonePe said that the initiative will help Indian tourists to provide familiar payment options during their stay.
